With COVID restrictions in place, Haven Acres wasn't open to the public, so they started taking horses to meet kids at their homes one at a time. When our special day arrived, I came home from work and followed their truck and trailer into our residential development. I was overcome with goosebumps of excitement and began to cry with joy, thankful to God for bringing the Heath's into our lives. This day was going to have a positive impact on the life of our son! It takes a lot to make Nick smile, but as I took pictures of him with Jenifer, Holly, and Beau, a HUGE smile spread across his face from ear to ear, showing how happy he truly was.

As a parent, I knew the mentorship program at Haven Acres would be an excellent opportunity for Nick to have something of his very own. He is the youngest of four children and is not into sports and activities like his brother and sisters. He is quite a homebody. Nick also has learning disabilities and a low self-esteem. At 13 years old, he is already 6' 2" and 185 pounds. As a result, he often times experiences teasing from other kids.

When Haven Acres opened again, Tuesday's quickly became Nick's favorite day of the week because he knew he was going to the ranch. He enjoyed getting to know his horse, Beau, and since he desires to become a farmer someday, he thoroughly appreciated learning about life on a farm. Terry ended up being the perfect mentor for Nick since he also wanted to be a farmer when he was growing up. Now he is more determined to accomplish his future goal of having a farm of his own when he grows up.

Nick also liked learning about the horses and how to take care of them. Riding Beau and doing daily chores were highlights of his sessions. Nick learned how to responsibly care for a horse, how to build trust - in the horse and in himself - and how to overcome his fear of working with a large animal and trying something new that's out of his comfort zone.

Benefits of Nick's sessions at Haven Acres last summer include: a change in his demeanor and a sense of confidence we hadn't seen before. He began to stand up tall and was no longer slouching, he spoke more, no longer keeping things bottled up inside. He became more open to chore requests at home without arguing, and he even started participating in activities with other kids even though it was uncomfortable at times.

To illustrate his new-found confidence, Nick agreed to bowl in the Haven Acres Bowling for Bucks fundraiser in the fall. Nick had not been bowling since he was about 5 years old. He didn't know how to hold the bowling ball or roll it down the alley. Having Jason come over and give him direction was awesome. Jason's kind and gentle nature made Nick feel at ease. Nick was, again, open to trying something new and not being afraid of possibly failing. When he had a turn where he didn't hit any pins, he would laugh rather than getting frustrated, angry, and shutting down. He stood tall and proud at how well he did!
